Problem

Collection Challenges

Unsustainable costs of providing access, discovery, and preservation of analog and digital collections

Developing and implementing long-term strategies for building and maintaining

- physical and virtual collections of
- primary (e.g. special collections and data) and secondary sources (e.g. books, journals, newspapers) for
- current and future users

Solution

Collection Opportunities

We, like all academic libraries, must regularly deselect/withdraw items or cancel subscriptions from our local collection and rely on a **collective collection**.

We are fortunate to belong to a strong network of partner libraries from across the country and world, working cooperatively to build shared collections and services.

You will continue to have access to withdrawn items via **interlibrary loan**.

Sustainable Scholarship

We are shifting spending away from purchasing content from proprietary, closed, for-profit scholarly information providers and increasing investments to create and support community-owned infrastructure and shared digital resources.

Facilities

Without strategic investments in the Libraries' facilities, the University risks losing its investment in unique resources.

Long-term stewardship of collections requires funding for

- More space-efficient offsite shelving
- Recommended environmental conditions (HVAC)



De-duplication	~15,000	~16,000
Print serial de-duplication	~9,000	~4,000
Monographs from partner libraries	~13,000	~1,500

- **De-duplication**: withdrawal of duplicate copies of the same edition of a monograph.
- Print serial de-duplication: withdrawal of print runs of journals where we have purchased access to the online version and have agreements with other libraries to borrow the print copy if needed.
- Monographs from partner libraries: low/no usage individual monographs that are widely available from our partner libraries in the Summit consortium or through ILL.

<u>Libraries Offsite Shelving + iSchool Retrofit</u>

Project Components

- Phase 1: Significant expansion of climate-controlled off-site storage for UW Libraries collections.
- Phase 2A: Collection Relocation and Replacement (9/22- 1/23)
- ☐ Phase 2B: Retrofit of Allen Library
 South 1st Floor to increase student
 engagement and provide space for
 leading-edge research (1/23-5/23)
